## **Creating a Sense of Nationalism Through Music Matthew Franke**

Dr. Matthew Franke is Master Instructor of Music History at Howard University. He has a Ph.D. in musicology from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and a B.A. from the University of Puget Sound. His main research area is French and Italian opera in the long nineteenth century, particularly Massenet, Puccini, Mascagni, and Bizet. But he also has strong interests in global music and the role of music in creating a sense of nationalism.

## TED Talk: The Riddle of Experience vs. Memory



#### **Daniel Kahneman**

Daniel Kahneman is an Israeli psychologist and economist notable for his work on the psychology of judgment and decision-making, as well as behavioral economics, for which he was awarded the 2002 Nobel Memorial Prize in Economic Sciences (shared with Vernon L. Smith). His empirical findings challenge the assumption of human rationality prevailing in modern economic theory.

In 2011, he was named by Foreign Policy magazine in its list of top global thinkers. In the same year, his book *Thinking, Fast and Slow*, which summarizes much of his research, was published and became a best seller.



He is professor emeritus of psychology and public affairs at Princeton University's Woodrow Wilson School.

This presentation, given at a TED conference, uses examples from rations to colonoscopies, to reveal how our "experiencing selves" and our "remembering selves" perceive happiness differently.

## **NBRC Fundraising Committee Update**



The Fundraising Committee has expanded in size, and is now firming up plans to implement a **virtual walk/run/bike fundraiser in September 2020**, during the COVID-19 pandemic, entitled NB Rotary's **COVID Challenge**. A flyer and "blast" email will encourage participants to register by making a small contribution to the NB Rotary Foundation. Registered participants will be encouraged to ask friends and family to sponsor them in meeting their challenge through additional donations to the NB Rotary Foundation. Donations will fund the work of the Foundation, **Mercy Health Clinic**, and possibly one other medical aid charity. The plan is to acknowledge all donations on the NB Rotary website and/or on a Facebook page.

Mercy Health Clinic, located in Gaithersburg, provides essential healthcare, health education, and medications – free of charge – for more than 2000 low-income and uninsured adults in Montgomery County each year, through nearly 7,200 office visits.

Registrants completing their declared walk/run/bike goal will receive an NB Rotary medal and ribbon (see prototype above designed by our own **Kevin Flynn)** -- to celebrate their achievement and service to their community.

## **District News**

Here is a listing of accomplishments on two key goals (Membership and Grant) as reported by District Governor Barton through May 2020.

#### #1 Goal - Membership

- District 7620 had a net gain of 37 members yearto-date.
- Created and implemented a structured 'Lead Management & Tracking' process and technology to track all leads from both RI and individual clubs.
- Chartered two new Rotary clubs (Washington Global, with 38 members, and International Friendship with 43 members).
- Welcomed two new satellite clubs Washington Global Montgomery County, MD Satellite and Baltimore Evening Satellite.
- Launched a Digital Marketing program focused on enticing younger and female prospects to local clubs.
- Organized and implemented a Membership Summit attended by 70 Rotarians.

#### #2 Goal – Building a Giving & Grant Culture

- Reengineered the Grant approval process
- Allocated \$116,151 for 41 District DDF grants.
- 63% of all D7620 clubs received a District DDF grant – a new District record.
- Allocated an estimated \$200,000 for 16 Global Grants.
- Increased total giving from \$646,000 last year to greater than \$1.2 million this Rotary year – a new District record
