

Rotary role in Global Polio Eradication POLICERADICATION

- World's largest humanitarian service organization with a global network of 1.2 million members in more than 170 countries.
- First to have the vision of a polio-free world, through PolioPlus, 1985
- Primary responsibilities include fundraising, advocacy, and volunteer recruitment.
- More than one million Rotary members have volunteered their time and personal resources to polio eradication.
- Rotary members provide field support during National Immunization Days through social mobilization and by administering the oral polio vaccine to children.
- Main private sector donor
- By the time the world is certified polio-free, Rotary's contributions will exceed US\$2.72 bn, including US\$ 1.3 bn in matching funds from Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.
