MEMBERSHIP and PUBLIC RELATIONS COMMITTEES JOIN FORCES

Two NBRC committees met (via Zoom Conference) on June 24, 2021 and discussed several topics. Two major items emerged from the meeting.

- 1. **Fiscal Staus of the NBRC:** There is a clear and critical need to improve/strengthen the financial condition of the club in order to be a viable by identifying and organizing fund raising events to support any meaningful activities and projects to be sponsored in the near future. A need for setting strategy and achievable goal to increase the balance of funds should be the top priority of the NBRC.
- 2. Database of prospective members and outreach: The membership and PR committees could work together to create the database and develop an implementation plan to recruit new, qualified members dedicated to the RI and NBRC mission. Each current member should make a serious attempt to take responsibility for recruiting a qualified and enthusiastic Club member this year. A minimum goal of recruiting 10 members for NBRC in 2021-2022 was recommended. The Club promotion tools such as linking a webinar video to Facebook, our YouTube channel and the NBRC website, making presentations of NBRC's and RI's mission to local profit and nonprofit organizations and leveraging resources with other Rotary Clubs in the area may be considered. We suggest that the webinar video's development could be delayed until NBRC's fiscal condition is improved, even though the value of a webinar is a clear need to us. The logistical details of creating a video could be worked out by including testimonials of beneficiaries of recent and past activities sponsored by the NBRC.

NBRC VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR COMFORT CASES PROGRAM



The founder of Comfort Cases, Rob Scheer, was given a trash bag to pack his belongings as he entered his first foster home at the age of 12. When he aged out of the system at 18, he became homeless, and again packed up his belongings in a trash bag.

Nearly 30 years later, when he became a foster parent, his four children arrived at his home with trash bags. He was saddened that nothing had changed. In 2013, Rob's family and their community founded **Comfort Cases** and set out on a mission to eliminate trash bags from the foster care system.

Over 700 children enter the foster care system each day. MOST ARE GIVEN A TRASH BAG TO CARRY THEIR BELONGINGS.

These children have been neglected and often feel like they don't matter. Many do not own a toothbrush or have a pair of pajamas.

A **Comfort Case** gives a child entering foster care a sense of dignity and hope. Each is packed with a cozy new pair of pajamas, a stuffed animal to hug, a toothbrush, soap, and other personal care items.

The gift of these simple items tells a child, you matter.


CARLA SATINSKY ARCHIVES AT MONTGOMERY COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY
