# Habitat – Creating Homes in Montgomery County Sarah Reddinger, Vice President of Community Development, Habitat for Humanity




**Sarah Reddinger**, Vice President of Community Development for Habitat for Humanity Montgomery (also known as simply "Habitat"), oversees advocacy, homeowner services and lending, project management and feasibility, home clinic before becoming a banking analyst.

Under her leadership, the new and rehab potential project pipeline has grown from a few dozen projects to over 160 new units with projected budgets of over \$35 million. She's also grown the Repair and Weatherization Programs from about 30 projects a year to over 100, with a budget around \$2,000,000 annually. She launched the Repair and Accessibility Modification Program and a Veteran Repair Program to assist residents in their abilities to remain safely in their homes long term and ensure their ability to transfer wealth to the next generation.

Sarah's work to break down barriers to homeownership extends beyond the organization as well. She sits on the Executive Committee of the Montgomery

Housing Alliance, served on the Housing Equity Advisory Team with the Montgomery County Planning Department and coordinated an Aging in Place Learning Exchange. She also co-founded the Life Long Homes Coalition in Montgomery County. Sarah is a member of HFHI's Policy and Advocacy Professionals Group and recently joined the Community Development Network of Maryland's Public Policy Committee. As a Global Village Team Leader, she has led ten volunteer build trips to four continents.

She has served the department for over 40 years and has earned numerous commendations for her leadership and service including the prestigious County Employee of the Year award. Robin has a Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Education from the University of Maryland and her recognized professional expertise is reflected in the leadership and communication leadership skills promoting lifelong recreation and physical activity – for kids, seniors, and adults of all abilities and fitness levels. Robin, a lifelong Marylander, is an avid sports lover, and enjoys being a participant and an armchair coach with her beloved dachshunds.

Since 1954, Montgomery County Recreation (MCR) has remained dedicated to providing inclusive quality recreation programs and activities that serve the recreation and leisure needs of the Montgomery County community. The

department manages 40 facilities including an administrative headquarters, community and neighborhood recreation centers, senior centers, and indoor and outdoor aquatic facilities and provides thousands of programs such as out-of-school activities, aquatics classes, youth and adult sports programs and leagues, senior programs, and therapeutic recreation.

## **DISTRICT GRANTS**

#### District 7620 Grant Guidelines

The window for grant applications submission for Rotary Year 2022-2023 is March 1, 2023 – May 31, 2023; grant application submissions received after that date are unlikely to be funded.

- Grants applications submission are only acceptable electronically via DACdb Grants Module
- The Club President and Club Foundation Chair (during the year the grant is approved) (or a designated appointee, who will be involved with the management of the grant) **must** attend grant management and qualification training arranged by the District and maintain a trained member for the term of the grant.
- For a Grant Applicant to be eligible to receive DDF funding, the TRF's "Club Foundation Analysis Report" must reflect by June 30, 2023 the below accomplishments:
  - \$120 per capita minimum of club membership total giving to the Annual Fund.
  - 50% of club members contribute \$25 to the Annual Fund.
  - 50% of club members are a Paul Harris Fellow.
- Club with approved grants will receive 50% of their grant money upon review and approval of the project; the remaining 50% will be paid upon the completion of all report requirements of the project.
