# Curing with Sound Jessica Foley



Jessica Foley, PhD is Managing Director and Chief Scientific Officer for the Focused Ultrasound Foundation, whose mission is to accelerate the development and adoption of focused ultrasound, a breakthrough noninvasive therapeutic medical technology. Dr. Foley guides strategy, development, and implementation of scientific and research programs for the Foundation, and aligns these with business operations, communications, and development activities. She leads alliance-building efforts with external stakeholders including governmental policymakers, regulatory agencies, and disease-specific foundations whose interests are complementary to those of the Foundation. She is a spokesperson and advocate for the Foundation and the focused ultrasound community among a wide variety of stakeholders. Prior to the Foundation she spent several years in the medical device industry (Insightec, Medtronic) and was a AAAS Science and Technology Policy Fellow at the National Science Foundation. She holds a BSE in Biomedical Engineering from Duke University and a PhD in Bioengineering from the University of Washington.

# **Rotary Charitable Foundation of North Bethesda Update**

Club Fundraising Raises Foundation Resources

Our club's foundation, known as the Rotary Charitable Foundation of North Bethesda, has been growing. Currently, the bank balance is slightly less than \$20,000--last year at this time, the balance was around \$14,000. We've been able to increase the balance thanks to some generous contributions from friends of Rob Follit, as well as successful fundraisers for our backpack program, our Thanksgiving donations, and the Christmas ornament sales.

In memory of Rob Follit, we have raised nearly \$3,000. Rob's wife Jane asked that donations be made the Foundation, and we have received 16 donations ranging from \$20 to \$1000. We appreciate the donations and will be thanking the donors with a letter in the next few weeks as well as sending a notification to Jane.

The Christmas ornament sale was successful, thanks to Carmela and her family. We sold 95 ornaments at \$25 each and netted about \$600 for the Foundation as a result. We are going to miss Carmela, who revitalized the Foundation and helped get our bank account straight. Carmela also was working on getting an online donation program to work through the NB Rotary website.

In some separate fundraising efforts, we raised \$450 for Thanksgiving meals coordinated by Dan Moore. We actually have about \$100 left over from that effort, which we spent about \$350 on.


Our backpack program last fall was also successful. Thanks to Joh Waterston for coordinating that. This year we are hoping to get a sales tax exemption from the State of Maryland. That will also help with the Christmas ornament sales.



We also were able to give out one **scholarship** to Lexus Soumahoro, a worthy candidate who is attending the UMBC at Shady Grove. We had another candidate selected for a scholarship, but he decided not to return to school this year.

- We still have a considerable amount of funds available for scholarships. Some of these have been on the books for several years.
- We have funds available for donations to Rotary International, to help meet our quota to qualify for RI grants.
- We also have funds available for our own projects to match the grant projects that require matching funds.

Our new chairman is **Nick Martinez**. As per the Foundation bylaws, the immediate Past President of the club becomes the Chairman of the Foundation on the January of the following year. So the President leaves office in July, then has 6 months off before becoming chair of the foundation. We're hoping for a great new year! Nick, by the way, ran a successful "popup" fundraiser last summer for the Kentucky Derby. We're hoping he'll continue the good efforts!
