Potomac River Drought Forecasting Michael Nardolilli, Executive Director Interstate Commission on the Potomac River Basin



This year's dry spring and summer months have led to a very low flow in the Potomac River, the main source of drinking water in the Washington area. With the flow near record lows, local governments in the Washington Area are moving forward on drought monitoring and planning using a system developed over the past several decades by the Interstate Commission on the Potomac River Basin (ICPRB). The Executive Director of ICPRB is **Michael Nardolilli**, our speaker for September 8.

Michael joined the ICPRB as its Executive Director on April 1, 2019. Previously, Mr. Nardolilli served as the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority, President of the Arlington Outdoor Lab, Executive Director

of the Montgomery Parks Foundation, President of the C&O Canal Trust, and President of the Northern Virginia Conservation Trust. Michael has a JD from the College of William & Mary and a BSFS from Georgetown University.

Montgomery County's Sheriff's Office Sheriff Maxwell C. Uy Office of the County Sheriff



Sheriff Maxwell C. Uy was initially elected as Montgomery County's 62nd Sheriff on November 8, 2022. He officially began his term on December 1, 2022. Sheriff Uy is the first Asian-American to hold the Office of Montgomery County Sheriff.

Prior to his election, Sheriff Uy spent over two years as Chief Deputy, directing every aspect of the daily operations of the Sheriff's Office. During his law enforcement career, Sheriff Uy rose through the ranks, serving in nearly every section of the Sheriff's Office.

Sheriff Uy was raised in Fremont, California. Shortly after graduating high school, he enlisted as an active-duty member of the U.S. Army. He ultimately relocated to the East Coast as a member of the U.S. Army's Old Guard 3rd US Infantry

Regiment, before joining the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office as a deputy in 1994.

The Sheriff's Office is the oldest law enforcement agency in Montgomery County, Maryland having been established in July of 1777. The Maryland Constitution provides that the Sheriff be elected every four years and the Office comes under the Judicial Branch of Government. The Sheriff is therefore a State Constitutional Officer who functions autonomously from the Legislative and Executive branches of government.

Business of the Year Award to Levine School of Music



On Monday, August 21, Club Secretary **Linda Berg-Cross** presented our club's "Business of the Year" award to **Levine School of Music** at their Strathmore location. The Levine School serves communities across the DC area with campuses in Strathmore, Silver Spring, NW DC, THEARC in SE DC, Arlington, and Falls Church as well as a virtual campus for students studying online. Students of all ages and skill levels study nearly every instrument you can imagine.

Levine's Music Therapy program serves more than 300 children and adults with physical and cognitive impairments, including Down syndrome, autism spectrum disorders, and dementia. Services are provided at all campuses

and in partnership with organizations across the region, including Sitar Arts Center, Montgomery County schools, DC Public Schools, senior living centers, and centers for developmentally disabled adults. Other community service efforts of Levine include:

- **Levine's Tuition Assistance** program serves hundreds of students each year at a cost to Levine of \$600,000, with students receiving need-based tuition assistance averaging \$1500 per student, representing an 80% subsidy.
- Through its **First Music community engagement program**, Levine provides free or 80% subsidized weekly instruction to approximately 200 students at partnership sites, equipping students at a pivotal age with the vital cognitive skills necessary to achieve academic success in early grade school and beyond as they begin their academic journey.
- Levine annually holds 200 **free or low-cost events** open to the public including community events like our "MusicalTeas" and "Community Sings"
- During the 2021-22 school year, Levine visited six distinct schools across the region, with return visits in the fall and spring, to perform a **free strings presentation** showcasing the Levine faculty and introducing students to the cello.
