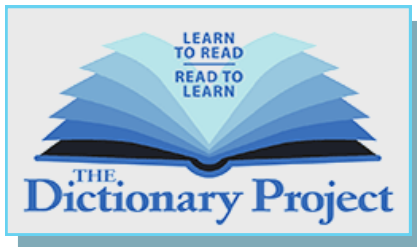
3-minute Twofer
